

**IN RE: GUANTANAMO BAY
DETAINEE CONTINUED ACCESS
TO COUNSEL**

ORDERED that the motions for Voluntary Dismissal Without Prejudice and for Continued Access to Counsel Pursuant to the Protective Order in civil actions 05-cv-1638 (CKK) (petitioner Ghanem), 05-cv-2185 (RCL) (petitioner Al-Mudafari), 05-cv-2186 (ESH) (petitioner Al-Mithali), and 05-2380 (CKK) (petitioner Al-Baidany) are hereby **GRANTED**, and that each of these petitioners' cases shall be dismissed without prejudice; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that the Protective Order issued by Judge Hogan on September 11, 2008, shall remain in effect and provide the rules under which detainees in civil actions 04-cv-1254 (RCL) (petitioners Esmail and Uthman), 05-cv-1638 (CKK), 05-cv-2185 (RCL), 05-cv-2186 (ESH), and 05-2380 (CKK) held at the United States Naval Base in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, may have access to counsel so long as they remain confined and have the right to seek further relief by habeas corpus, whether or not a petition is currently pending before the Court.
